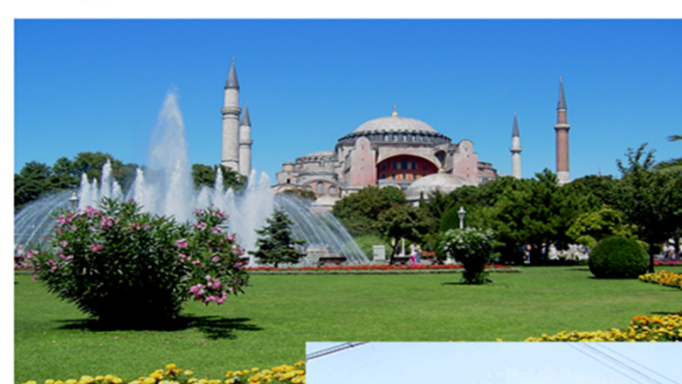




ICA Academic initiative on Continuing Education Workshops

We had initiated development of International Continuing Education Workshops in Ukraine, Turkey and China. The purpose of this initiation is to improve professional cartographic knowledge and mapping skills of practitioners who work in the field of GIS projects development and implementation since these specialists are the more and more frequently facing with problems of search and evaluation of different map sources for cartographic databases creation, as well as with problems of map visualisation and thematic maps modelling on the GIS basis. Thus the lack of professional cartographic knowledge and mapping skills decreases the quality and efficiency of GIS project development and use.

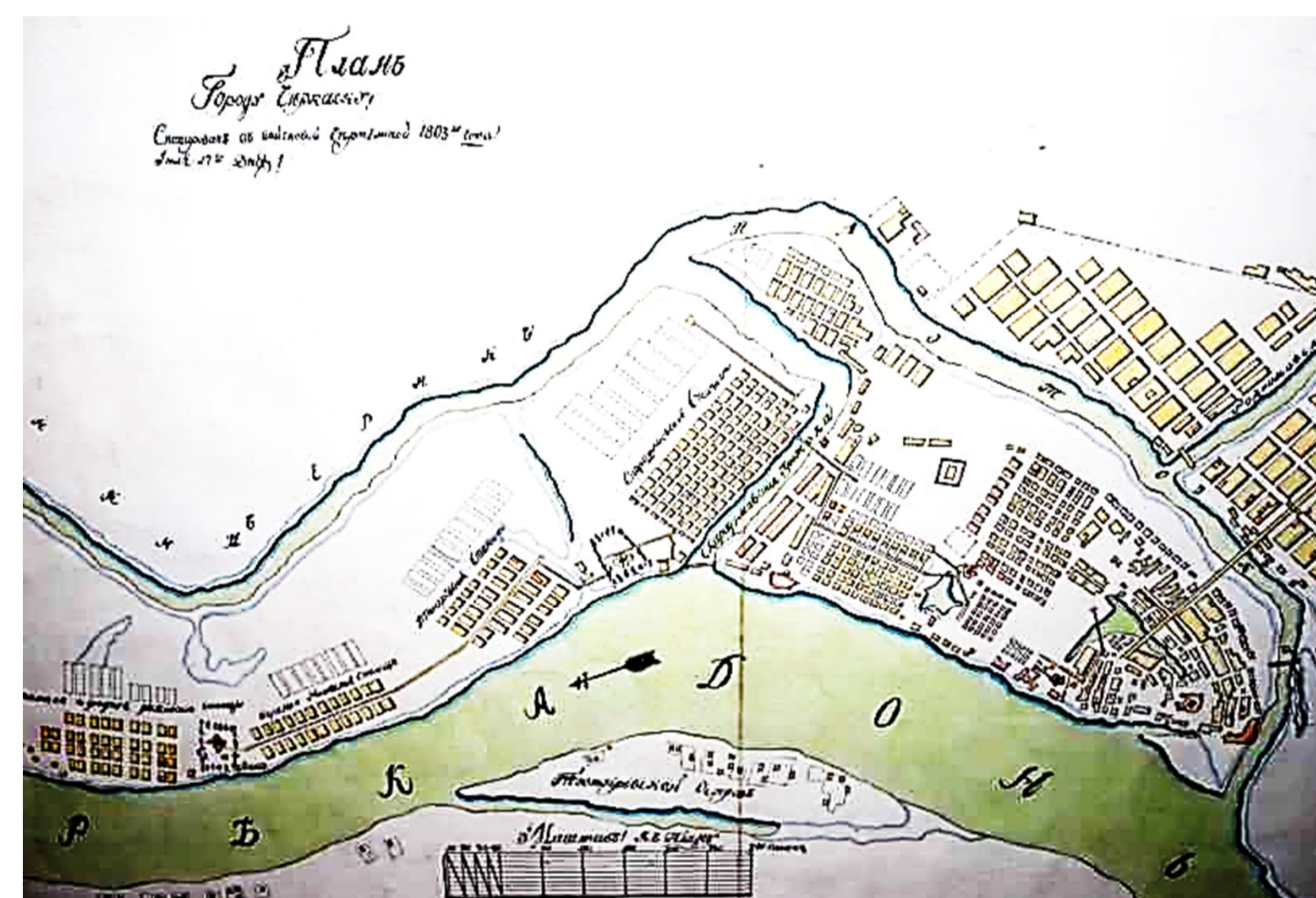
The Benefits of ICA Education Workshops for GIS practitioners are following:
